



EAA Chapter 992 Center City Flyers Scholarship Application

Thank you for your interest in the EAA Chapter 992, Center City Flyers, Annual Education Scholarships.

1. Purpose

The purpose of our scholarships is to provide financial assistance to college, university or technical school students participating in fields of study directly related to aviation.

2. Eligibility

Educational scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors and post-secondary students, from communities surrounding the Marshfield and Medford, Wisconsin area (see Section 7, "[Geographic Qualification](#)"), with aviation-related career goals. Previous recipients who are currently enrolled in undergraduate aviation-related programs are also eligible. The students must attend a college, university or technical school after receiving confirmation of the award.

3. Payment of Scholarship

- 3.1. Scholarships valued at five hundred dollars (\$500) will be paid to the awardees at the start of the second academic semester.
- 3.2. The number of scholarships offered is dependent upon demand and the pool of scholarship funds available.
- 3.3. Each scholarship will be paid jointly to the post-secondary school and the student. Joint endorsements are required.
- 3.4. Proof of satisfactory completion of the first semester must be submitted to the EAA Chapter 992 Scholarship Committee for review prior to the disbursement of scholarship funds. Academic eligibility is at the subjective discretion of the Scholarship Committee.
- 3.5. The scholarship awards may only be used for tuition, books, fees, supplies and equipment that are directly related to the recipients' academic attendance at the college, university or technical school.

4. Selection of Candidates

The selection of candidates will be the responsibility of the EAA Chapter 992 Scholarship Committee. The number of recipients chosen each academic year from available applicants will be based on the quality of the applications and the pool of available scholarship funds.

5. Forfeiture

If a recipient drops out of his or her academic program during the first semester for academic reasons, the scholarship will be forfeited. If a recipient drops out of the program for other reasons, the cause and possible forfeiture shall be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee.

6. Deadlines

The deadline for submission of this scholarship application is May 1 of the academic year for which this application applies.

7. Geographic Qualification

The scholarships provided by EAA Chapter 992 are intended for local students graduating from high school or students participating in aviation-related undergraduate studies at colleges, universities, or technical schools in the Continental United States, including Hawaii and Alaska. "Local" is defined as communities served by EAA Chapter 992 and Center City Flyers, in and near Marshfield and Medford, Wisconsin, which are not served by other area EAA chapters. Cities, villages and townships currently served by EAA Chapter 992 include:

Additional communities will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the Scholarship Committee.

8. Availability

Please note that scholarships will not be awarded if no qualified applicants submit applications. Further, these scholarships may or may not be available in the future.
